INTRODUCTION

Joy G. Rosser of Somerville, Tennessee loaned the Armstrong Family Letters, 1832-1901, were loaned for microfilming. The collection is organized in alphabetical and chronological order. The collection consists of .5 cubic feet, and there are no restrictions.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Armstrong Family Letters consists primarily of correspondence between Thomas Lapsley Armstrong of Somerville, Fayette County, Tennessee, and his brother Anderson Armstrong of Hillsborough, North Carolina, concerning family and community news. Also included are typed transcripts of the letters, a wedding invitation to Mrs. G. Blake and Miss Armstrong from Mr. & Mrs. R. N. Christian, a biographical sketch of Thomas Lapsley Armstrong and William Henry Blake, as well as several obituaries.
