## **INTRODUCTION**

The Josephine A. Pearson papers (ca. 1860-1943) are centered on Josephine Anderson Pearson (1868-1944), anti-suffrage leader, collector and compiler of family data, educator, traveler and lecturer and writer of *Monteagle* and *Nashville, Tennessee*. The papers were a gift by Miss Pearson.

The materials in this collection measure 7.0 cubic feet. There are no restrictions on the collections. Single photocopies of unpublished writings in the Josephine A. Pearson Collection may be made for purposes of scholarly research.

## SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Josephine A. Pearson Papers, containing approximately 3,500 items, cover the period ca. 1860-1943. The collection is composed of accounts, anti-suffrage ratification, cards, certificates, church records, correspondence, court records, diaries and memoirs, the Dixie Highway Association, genealogical data, invitations, land records, legal documents, newspaper clippings, notebooks, obituaries, a passport, photographs and drawings, poetry, printed materials, school records, scrapbooks, sketches, speeches, tributes, writings, and several miscellaneous items.

About one-third of the collection is made up of correspondence, both incoming and outgoing. Incoming correspondence is generally of a family nature as well as educational matters relating to various teaching and administrative positions held by Miss Pearson. The outgoing correspondence of Miss Pearson largely consists of handwritten copies - often several in number - of letters to her correspondents. There are two folders (see Box 6, f. 10 and Box 7, f. 13) of unidentified correspondence.

Prominent correspondents include A. S. Colyar, H. Clay Evans, Albert B. Fall, Thomas F. Gailor, Kenneth McKellar, Joseph W. Martin, Jr., and J. Percy Priest.

Genealogical data is found in the collection for the Buntin, Howell, Pearson, Raiford and Roscoe families.

There are numerous newspaper clippings on the above mentioned families as well as the Montegale, (Tennessee) Ladies Association. In addition, clippings of letters submitted by Miss Pearson to various Tennessee newspapers on various contemporary topics will be found.

The collection contains many unpublished poems and writings by Josephine Pearson. The writings have been arranged alphabetically.

Miss Pearson as an educator, traveler and spokesperson for women opposed to women's suffrage had many opportunities to address various interest groups. Handwritten and typed copies of many of her speeches may be found in the collection.

Two unique features of the Josephine A. Pearson Papers are the materials on anti-suffrage ratification and the Dixie Highway Association. Miss Pearson was the president of the Tennessee State Association Opposed to Woman Suffrage, and she was therefore personally active in the unsuccessful fight in her home state to block the ratification of the proposed Nineteenth Amendment. Anti-suffrage ratification items include broadsides, clippings, correspondence, newspapers, notes (by Amanda C. Roscoe Pearson), a petition, photographs, press releases, printed materials, resolutions, speeches, and writings by Pearson.

Miss Pearson also served as chairman of the Cumberland Division of the Dixie Highway Association. This part of the collection contains clippings, correspondence, memorabilia, several copies of the publication "The Dixie Highway," and writings by Pearson on behalf of the Association.

### **Josephine Anderson Pearson**

- 1868            June 30 – Born in the home of grandfather, Thomas Howell Roscoe, near Gallatin (Sumner County), Tennessee, the only child of Reverend Philip Anderson and Amanda Caroline (Roscoe) Pearson
- Educated at Gallatin Female College
- ca. 1880        Graduated with B.A. degree from Irving College in McMinnville, Tennessee
- 1886            Graduated with M.A. degree from Cumberland College in Lebanon, Tennessee
- Studied at Vanderbilt and the University of Missouri
- 1890-1894     Principal of High School in McMinnville, Tennessee
- 1895-1897     Principal of Nashville College for Young Ladies in Nashville, Tennessee
- 1896            Appointed Commissioner from Warren County to the Woman's Board of the Tennessee Centennial
- 1897-1899     Held Chair of English at Winthrop State Normal College for Women in Rock Hill, South Carolina
- 1901-1908     Held an executive position in the Woman's Congress at the Montevallo Assembly (Chataqua)
- 1902-1908     Held Chair of History and English at Higbee School in Memphis, Tennessee
- 1909-1914     Dean and held Chair of Philosophy of Christian College, affiliated with the University of Missouri in Columbia, Missouri
- 1917-1920     President of the Tennessee State Association Opposed to Women's Suffrage
- 1920            President of the Southern Woman's League for Rejection of the Susan B. Anthony Amendment

- 1917-1922 Dean and held Chair of Philosophy and History at Southern Seminary in Buena Vista, Virginia
- 1923 June – Organized the course of study for the novices of the Anglican Convent at Fon du Lac, Wisconsin
- Dean and held Chair of Philosophy and History at March College in Staunton, Virginia
- 1931-1932 Taught English and Philosophy at St. Agnes College for Women and the Memphis Conservatory of Music in Memphis, Tennessee
- 1944 November 3 – Died in Nashville, Tennessee and buried in Monteagle Cemetery, Monteagle, Tennessee
